Thank you for your continued support. We look forward to more successes in the coming terms!






<u>What is a Thinking</u> School?






<u>Our School Rules</u>

Thank you for your continued support in upholding our high expectations for behaviour.



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
<u>World Book Day</u>

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
<u>Healthy Eating</u>

At Kings Ash Academy, we understand the importance of healthy eating and how it supports our children's well-being and learning. A balanced lunchbox can help fuel your child's day, ensuring they stay focused and energetic in class.

We encourage you to include a variety of nutritious items in your child's lunchbox, such as:

- Fresh fruits and vegetables (e.g., apple slices, carrot sticks, or cucumber)
 - Whole grains (e.g., wholemeal sandwiches, wraps, or crackers)
 - Lean protein (e.g., chicken, hummus, or cheese)
 - **Dairy or dairy alternatives** (e.g., yogurt, cheese sticks)
 - Healthy snacks (e.g., nuts, raisins, or a small portion of whole grain crisps)

We also kindly remind you that children in **Reception**, **Year 1**, **and Year 2** are eligible for **universal free school meals**, and we encourage you to take advantage of this benefit. For families with children in other year groups, if you think your child may be eligible for **free school meals**, please check with the school office for further information. 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
<u>No Outsiders</u>

At Kings Ash Academy, we are proud to continue our work on the '**No Outsiders**' scheme, which celebrates inclusion, diversity, tolerance, and respect for all individuals. This initiative is central to our values, helping our children learn about and appreciate the differences that make our world a richer, more compassionate place.

As part of 'No Outsiders', our students participate in regular assemblies that explore real-life stories from around the world. These stories encourage reflection on how we can create a more accepting and tolerant society. This half term, we've explored some powerful themes, including:

- A championship-winning Muslim girls' football team who all play in hijabs
- Reflections on being welcoming, through the story of Paddington Bear and his journey as an immigrant
- Acknowledging Holocaust Memorial Day, fostering understanding and remembrance

<u>Uniform reminders</u>

Just a reminder that children can come into school in *school PE kit* on their class PE days (please note, football or other team kits are not allowed). As the colder weather approaches, children are welcome to wear their school jumper and plain black leggings/jogging bottoms on PE days.

<u>Thank you</u>


Firstly, thank you to all of you for making such a positive contribution to attendance and lateness. Punctuality is much improved overall as a school and attendance is also steadily improving .This has allowed the children to be settled and in class ready for their learning to begin. It is important that we continue to all work together to ensure that our attendance is at its highest possible level whilst also reducing our lateness where possible.

<u>Lateness</u>

A reminder that classroom doors open at 8:40am and all children are expected to enter through these doors before the 8:50am close. After this point, your child will then be classed as late meaning that they are missing vital learning time. Should your child arrive at school later than 9:00am this will have to be marked as an unauthorised session. The new national framework states '10 unauthorised sessions in a 10 week period can lead to a penalty notice'. If you feel you require any support with this please contact me directly.

Attendance updates


<u>Absence</u>

As we see a rise in coughs, colds and other illnesses and would also remind you that children should only be absent from school when it is absolutely necessary. I would encourage you to help support your children from any missed learning by encouraging them to come to school whenever possible. To record any absence please contact the office or Mr.Fegan to discuss the reason for this. Just **10** school days missed across the whole year would mean that your child would be below the expected attendance expectation.

Rewards and Celebrations

As a school we want to show all children just how important attendance is to us and so we will be launching a new range of rewards

- Each week- children will be acknowledged for making a significant effort to improve their attendance or lateness in our weekly celebration assembly.
- Every half term- children will be awarded with bronze, silver or gold certificates depending on their attendance.




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<u>Wonder Dome</u>




