Children will learn how to use the expanded method to help them solve multiplication problems and the partition method to solve division problems. Children need to be confident with their 2, 3, 4, 5, 8 and 10 times tables. It would be helpful if children could practice these at home.

Science: Our science unit is called Amazing Bodies.
