This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

The music curriculum overview can be viewed on the school website. This shows the curriculum offer for all year groups at Kings Ash Academy from Nursery to Year 6. Our curriculum has been designed to be inclusive for all pupils, providing opportunities for music exploration and development.

Every class from Nursery to Year 6 receives 1 hour of class music provision.

We use the Kapow scheme as our curriculum guidance which fully meets the requirements of the national curriculum and beyond. In addition, we also include use of other programs to support including Charanga (YUMU). Adaptations are also made to include content from organisations including; The Royal Opera House and Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra.

Singing is a core part of the music curriculum and as such every lesson includes an opportunity for group singing. Children also take part in weekly singing assemblies with their phase. In the curriculum overview each year group have opportunities for playing instruments through the year and performing using them. Whole-class ensemble teaching takes place in every year group.

Kings Ash Academy is part of the Torbay music hub and utilises as many opportunities as possible. Our young people recently performed as part of a joint choir at Armed Forces Day. We also have peripatetic violin teaching in school as an additional opportunity for our pupils.

To support our music delivery, the school works closely with:

Torbay Music Hub - instrument provision

Sound Communities - Further opportunities for radio presenting

Part B: Extra-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

For opportunities outside of lesson time, the following opportunities are provided for children to progress in music beyond the curriculum offer:

- Fortnightly 30 minute singing assembly (split into Year 1, 2, 3 and Year 4, 5, 6)
- After school club choir 45 minute weekly club offered to years 3,4,5 & 6 throughout the year providing opportunities for performing en-semble
- After school club performing arts club 45 minute weekly club offered to years 3,4,5 & 6 throughout the year providing opportunities for performing solo and en-semble as part of a production
- After school music club to explore instruments and performing as an ensemble.
- Access to KS1 lunchtime music club (once weekly) access to Yr1, 2 & 3
- Access to KS2 lunchtime music club (once weekly) access to Yr4, 5 & 6
- Offer of violin tuition for pupils in Year 3, 4, 5 or 6.
- Other forms of music making access to music online program (Charanga-YUMU)

There are multiple opportunities for children in the above clubs to perform to their peers, parents and public. Annually the choirs perform at our large scale school music performance as well as termly performances and at local community events.

From September 2024, the school will have Arts Ambassadors/Creative Arts leaders who will support with the delivery of clubs and promote wider school engagement for the arts. They take an active role in performances and the arts leadership in the school.

Part C: Musical events/performances

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

At Kings Ash Academy, we recognise the importance of additional musical experiences and therefore plan these opportunities throughout the year. These events include:

- Fortnightly singing assembly 30 minutes singing en-semble
- Year 6 leaver's play including musical numbers
- Violin players performance to school/parents individual & en-semble
- Drumming en-semble performance to school/parents
- EYFS nativity/christmas performance singing en-semble
- KS1 christmas performance singing en-semble
- KS2 carol service singing en-semble
- Public choir performances i.e. local community
- Select pupil attendance at orchestra performance in Exeter
- Year 5 or 6 attendance at Paignton Academy pantomime performance
- Attendance of select pupils at Torbay and South Devon Music Centre rehearsals and performance

We are always looking at new opportunities for musical experiences throughout the year and organise additional to the above as opportunities arise.

In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

- Planning in wider opportunities for experiencing a range of live music performances for the whole school during academic year 24/25
- Strive for successful completion of ArtsMark status at Kings Ash Academy by 2026.
- Develop the role of Arts Ambassadors/Creative Arts leaders throughout 2024/25 academic year.
